allowed to work in anything major again (the studio said it was because of his drinking, but I knew the man and his drinking was never a problem until after he was out of work for a few years). Actor James Garner (who just passed away) was another witness to saucers going in and out of the waters of the Pacific - but he was smart enough to never talk about it but to trusted friends.

I shall talk more about the off-shore facilities in the future - the reason this has taken on new life, of course, is that the main entry doors were jammed open for several weeks, and ended up being spotted by a number of commercial sources for the first time. Normally, the complex is very secure, and you could go over it all day long with fishing boats (sonar) and space imagry and never spot anything out of the orninary (the entry is location in the side of the existing underwater shelf). The same is true of a number of such bases off the southern California coast, including several ruins of now-dead bases built by non-human species that are very impressive (as hard as it may be to believe, we nuked one of them in the 1950s, only a few hundred miles west of L.A.) All of this deserves more attention. Let me quickly mention that I've also read a lot of crazy stuff in the last few months about tunnels large enough for L.A.-class submarines to travel in, from the coast inland to China Lake. That's just government misinformation to make the whole thing sound more like a hoax. Anytime the public learns about something that needs to be kept quiet, the best way to deal with the situation is to make the story sound so fantastic that people accept that the whole things must be a lie.
